

Supervision for eligible students at school

It is important that we support the government in reducing contact between groups of children and adults and wherever possible have the minimum number of children and staff in any place at any one time. However, we also recognise our role in supporting the country to continue to function. Healthcare professionals, those identified as key workers and vulnerable groups of children will need our support.

If you or your partner are identified as key workers, then our schools are offering emergency childcare/ supervision. Please support our already stretched and concerned staff by only using these facilities if you are unable to make any other arrangements. For instance, you may be a key worker but do not need to send your child to Hull Trinity House Academy with other children and staff, because you are able to make other arrangements e.g. your partner is able to work from home.
